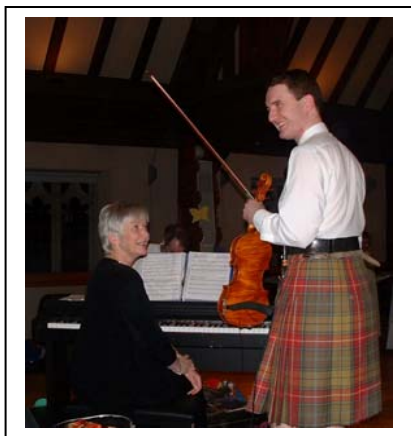

SCD Workshop in Szeged

To enable you to discover this charming, lively university town, the sunniest place in Hungary about 170 km south of Budapest, with its Mediterranean pavement cafés and one of the most beautiful 19th century ballrooms in Europe, we are organising a weekend of morning SCD classes with Muriel Johnstone, Keith Smith, Eric Finley and Bill Zobel, and evening dancing, from 21st May to 24th May 2010.



In addition an optional one-day excursion (including traditional goulash cooking, wine tasting and dancing on the grass) will be organised to Ópusztaszer, a historic site, 25 km from Szeged where the conquering Hungarian tribes swore a blood oath in 896 AD as well as a 4-day trip to Transylvania.

The course participants will be split into two groups, one for experienced dancers and the other for dancers who are not fully familiar with all the figures in Scottish Country Dancing.

Accommodation will be available at the 4-star Novotel Hotel on the banks of the Tisza (each room offering a splendid view of the river).

An optional walking and novelty train tour of Szeged will be arranged on Friday provided there is sufficient demand.

On Friday evening, a welcome dinner will be organised.

On Saturday and Sunday lunch will be served (with vegetarian options) at the Bajor Söröző and an optional buffet dinner can be booked for 2 days at the Novotel.

Venue

Szeged, an ideal holiday destination with many sports facilities and swimming pools, is situated at the confluence of the rivers Tisza and Maros. Today it is the fourth biggest town in Hungary with some 170,000 inhabitants. A strategically important settlement since ancient times and a free royal town since 1498, Szeged was literally swept away by the Great Flood of 1879. Thanks to donations from European capitals such as Vienna, London, Paris, Berlin, Brussels and Rome, reconstruction work was completed 4 years later.

Szeged, famous for its fish soup and also known as the home of paprika, a red spice often used in Hungarian dishes, holds an annual celebration on 21st May to mark the day when it regained the privilege of free royal town status with a series of outdoor festivities, including a wine festival, a handicrafts fair on the old bridge, concerts, fireworks and dancing in the streets. Sampling these is bound to make your stay even more enjoyable. Make the most of it!
